Groundbreaking on Liberty Center at Rio Salado

Mayor Mark Mitchell and the Tempe City Council will commemorate the groundbreaking of the Liberty Center at Rio Salado business park at a Dec. 2 ceremony. Liberty Property Trust was chosen by the City Council in February as the developer for the 106-acre, city-owned site at Priest Drive and Rio Salado Parkway, west of Tempe Town Lake. The development may create as many as 6,500 jobs over the next decade. It was among the projects highlighted by Mayor Mitchell at the Tempe Chamber's recent State of the City address.


